The current COVID-19 pandemic has heightened uncertainty over the economy, employment, finances, relationships, and of course, physical and mental health. It can drain you emotionally and trap you in a downward spiral of endless "what-ifs" and worst-case scenarios about what tomorrow may bring. [2]

What can we do once we found God's peace in us? Peace is not the absence of problems and difficulties of this life. Rather, it is the presence of God that walks with us through times of darkness and uncertainty. It carries with the idea of wholeness and completion.

Shalom gives us a vision that we can hold on to when the world around us is deeply fragmented. Let us reflect on this word and reconsider its importance in our modern lives. May we rediscover God's peace that is already in us.


