Bart Wildermuth Scholarship

History

Bart Wildermuth was a 1977 graduate of Lyman Hall High School and a member of this church when he unexpectedly died, at the age of 18, in November of 1977. While in high school he played trumpet in the school band, and was also a member of the baseball team, the key club, and the ski club. At the time of his death he was attending the University of New Haven pursuing a career in law enforcement.

At his parents request this church set up a scholarship that has been given out to a graduating senior in Wallingford since 1978. The Committee looks for the qualities that were evident in Bart:

Someone who is close to their family and active in their church and community. Someone with a great sense of humor and a love of music. Someone who has a dream for their future and is willing to pursue that dream through education.

Dear Friends,

Wow. What a year 2020 has been. I'm sure your family, like mine, has faced unexpected challenges. Thankfully, in the midst of it all, we have also found so much to be grateful for: going back to the basics, focusing on the most important things in life (faith, family, and health.

For the past 35 years, we've focused on helping families build resilience, thinking that resilience would be needed as families have to adapt to changing weather patterns, natural disasters, or geopolitical changes. We discovered that the household resilience model that we have been building towards has an even broader impact than we realized.

In Mexico, Angelina used the opportunity to start a vegetable garden, which fed her family, but also produced enough to sell some and give more to her neighbors in need. What a beautiful story of creativity and resilience in the face of hardship.

Sure, leaning into the unknown is uncomfortable. Yet, when so many things are uncertain, I find hope in the things that are eternal. How well am I loving my family and my neighbors? What can I do today that will continue to bulid a better world tomorrow? What will be legacy?
