Pastor's Letter

We often hear that life is good when a second chance is given. I agree with the statement, but the second chance is not about having another opportunity or extension of life that ends up with another failure or regret. The life we live after the resurrection of Christ Jesus is not about 'another life', but 'new life'. This new life is not our own, but with Christ Jesus who became the first fruit among the dead and it holds the resurrecting power of Christ Jesus. We do not expect sudden or dramatic changes outside of us. But we may expect changes inside of us: new goals in life, new attitude toward challenges, and a new way of life in godliness. We will live the life of Jesus and he will live our life as it is written in Galatians 2:20.

When Jesus gives us a new life, his promise to be with us will be with us always! Whatever we do and wherever we go, Christ Jesus ought to be honored and his good news about forgiveness and salvation must be heard and seen by others, so there will be a celebration of new life in Christ continually until the Day of the Lord. Prophet Habakkuk saw the vision of God in 2:14 on the Lord's Day,

But the earth will be filled with the knowledge of the glory of the Lord, as the waters cover the sea.

May the glory and resurrecting power of Christ Jesus be with you always! Amen.


