


church at that time. My heart is already excited for sharing the grace of God who renews all things everyday.

Mission with a Vision

What is the difference between a mission and a vision statement? A mission statement defines an organization's business, its objectives, and how it will reach these objectives. A vision statement details where the organization aspires to go. Why does our church exist? What is its place in our community? A church, our church, needs to have its purpose (mission) defined before we can choose our destination (vision).

We can assume our mission as followers of Jesus Christ was described to us in the Bible by Matthew 28:18-20:

¹⁸ Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. 19 Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

Simply put, Mission statement questions look like:

- What do we do?
- Whom do we serve?
- How do we serve them?

Thanks Matthew, thank you Jesus! Thank you God, the mission is clear!

Vision statement questions look like:

- What are our hopes and dreams?
- What problem are we solving for the greater good?
- Who and what are we inspiring to change?

The vision statement is meant to promote growth, both internally and externally. A strong vision helps members focus on what matters the most for their church. It also

invites innovation. A purpose-driven church envisions success because they know what success means for their organization.

On the flip side, a lack of vision is a road to nowhere for a church. Imagine this: stagnation, outdated processes, moving without purpose, feeling uninspired. Can a church even survive without a clear vision? You know the answer to that one.

Why are we even talking about this? Our church was tasked by the District Superintendent Rev. Dr. Alpher Sylvester to develop 4 S.M.A.R.T. (Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Relevant, Time-bound) for this year. It is a difficult enough task to come up with that, how would we accomplish this without being able to state our vision and know we were all on the same path?

So, our first goal for 2023 was to put together our VISION statement and I am happy to say we did it!
